School Transport

<u>Bikes</u>

Students are encouraged to cycle to school. There is a bike shed at school but pupils should bring in a secure lock for their bike. Students cycling to school <u>must</u> wear a cycle helmet. All cyclists must dismount and wheel their bicycles on site.

<u>Behaviour</u>

We launch our new Choice-Chance-Consequence Behaviour system in September with all year groups. I will share a presentation with you at the Information Evenings throughout September. These will be delivered remotely because of COVID guidance. The new system will involve C1-C5 consequence points, a whole school after school detention system and a new Isolation Room known as The Zacchaeus Room.

Whilst we feel the new behaviour system is fair and necessary we also appreciate our students will return to us needing support emotionally and academically. We have been planning our recovery curriculum entitle "Build Back Better" and please rest assured whatever need your child may have, as a result of this long absence from school, we will be there to support them.
