Dear Parents/Carers,

As we come to the end of this school year, the usual practice would be to highlight all the wonderful things that have happened this year. It would be easy to dismiss or write the year off but actually there were some things that have lifted our spirits and made the year so much more bearable!

We are so proud of all of our students but I would like to give a special shout out to our Year 7's. This amazing group of young people are a delight to be around and despite their first year being severely disrupted, they have remained positive and genuinely happy all the time. We are looking forward to giving them and all our students more opportunities and experiences next academic year.

As we begin to plan for a better year, I would like to draw you attention to the following:

### New School Year

The Government have indicated that schools will be expected to conduct Lateral Flow Tests at the start of term. Recent updates with regards to bubbles, masks and close contacts can be found here: https://educationhub.blog.gov.uk/2021/07/06/parents-pupils-teachers-and-students-find-out-what-step-4-of-the-covid-roadmap-means-for-you/. We are pleased that should someone test positive we will no longer have to send whole bubbles home. Although masks will no longer be required in school, we respect student's right to choose to wear a mask if it makes them feel comfortable.

As a consequence of having to do one Lateral Flow Test with students before they can go into classes, the testing and return to school schedule is as follows:

**Testing** 

Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> August – New Year 7 and Sixth Form Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> August – Years 8 & 9 Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> August – Years 10 & 11

We will operate the same booking system as before for the testing and we will share this link with you on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> July when it will go live. You will be requested to only book for the day allocated to your child's year group. Siblings may come together on one of the year group days.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> test for each student will take place once they have returned to school. Thereafter students will be expected to test twice weekly at home using the tests we provide. Results should be reported to NHS Track & Trace.

### **School Policies**

<u>Mobile Phones</u> – Mobile phones are not permitted in school for Years 7-11. Phones can be handed into the school office for safekeeping and collected at the end of the day. They are not to be seen or used on the school site. Any phone seen during this time will be confiscated and parents will be asked to collect it. An afterschool detention will be set for anyone who has their phone confiscated. Should a student have their phone out and refuse to hand it over when asked, this will result in a Fixed Term exclusion. A student who has their phone confiscated more than once in a term will also be sanctioned. Students should never use their phones to contact their parents during the school day, if we find this has happened the procedures above will apply.

All uniform must be worn correctly with care and pride at all times including travel to and from home.

# **School Priorities**

Our big school priorities next year will be reading and literacy. Form time in the morning has been extended by 10 minutes to allow for reading and literacy activities to take place. Please ensure your child has a reading book with them at all times. More information and updates about this through the year.

We have been taking some student and staff voice on homework this year. Mindful of our students wellbeing along with an awareness of how much students have to learn, our approach to homework next year will be that homework will only be set if it is to Review, Revise or consolidate; in other words, homework will not be used for "new" learning. We hope by using homework for these reasons only, it will be of benefit to our students when it comes to tests, assessment and exams.

We will also be delivering our new PHSE/RSE curriculum which runs through all year group and tackles lots of key areas like mental health, relationships, racism and appropriate behaviour. # <u>Bikes</u>

Students are encouraged to cycle to school. There is a bike shed at school but pupils should bring in a secure lock for their bike. Students cycling to school <u>must</u> wear a cycle helmet. All cyclists must dismount and wheel their bicycles on site. E-scooters are not permitted.

### **Dining in School**

We have a re-vamped school menu for next term. We took a number of pieces of Student Voice and it was clear that students wanted healthier food choices and we hope the new menu reflects this. We would like the majority of our students to eat hot meals at lunchtime so can I ask you to look at the menu with your child and encourage them to eat from Lydia's Restaurant at lunchtime. We are delighted to be able to offer lots of choice with regard to meat and vegetarian options. The menus will change daily and we will review the new dining arrangements and menus at October half term.

Students will be served hot food from 'Lydia's' restaurant and cold food and snacks from 'The Café'. We are moving to 2 lunchtimes next year after the success of split lunches this year. Please click <u>here</u> for the new menu and prices.

Please note we will only be serving food at breakfast and lunch from the start of the new school year. There will be no food or snacks served at break time.

We will continue to use ParentPay so please ensure that your child's account stays topped up. The machines will not be available in school for students to top up their accounts.


### And finally
