What is A level Spanish?

It is a subject in which the emphasis is placed on language work, where you will continue to build upon the skills already acquired at GCSE. The language is studied through the medium of audio materials, videos and written texts, covering a range of topics.

Specification

There are 4 modules for certification at A level:

Social issues and trends

Political and artistic culture

Grammar

Works: literary texts and films

Assessment at A level

Paper 1: listening, reading and writing

Paper 2: writing Paper 3: speaking

Uses (Higher Education and future career)

Naturally, an A level pass in Spanish can be, and often is, used as a mean of entry into Higher Education. However, with the many opportunities now available within Europe, many students find that knowledge of a foreign language to A level is seen as a desirable asset for an increasing number of professions and jobs. There are many economic and industrial opportunities for the linguist in the UK and in Europe.
