# **Other Updates**

<u>Traffic</u>

Cllr Adam Clarke came out early morning on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> December by invitation from myself and Mr Koorichh (Head of Krishna Avanti PS). We are all committed to improving the traffic and parking situation on Spencefield Lane and the school site. Cllr Clarke could see just how bad things were and is on board with funding solutions. In the short term he has committed to reinstating the ANPR camera on Spencefield Lane and instigating spot check traffic wardens over the coming weeks. In the longer term, there will be discussions about 'Park and Stride' as well as restrictions to turning into the school drive. In the meantime, please can I remind all parents that they are not allowed to drive down the school drive and that the school entrance is not a turning point to drop students off. There are plenty of side streets where students can be safely dropped off and collected in the morning and afternoon.

### **School Transport**

We continue to liaise with the Trust about school transport for 2023/2024. If you have not yet completed the short school transport survey we sent out recently, can I ask that you do so by 16<sup>th</sup> December.
