Another huge success was our school production of Frozen. With over 100 students involved and sell out performances, we are incredibly proud of all those involved. Our feeder primary schools enjoyed the dress rehearsal immensely too. My thanks to all the staff for their time and energy putting the show together.

Our DofE goes from strength to strength with 3 students undertaking their Gold award, 24 Silver and 46 Bronze. Ms Pinel leads on this and the staff who support her on expeditions do a great job. Recruitment for the Bronze award will start again in the Summer Term for the next academic year.

We were delighted to interview 187 of our Year 11 students and 40 external students for our Sixth Form next year. The quality of the interviews was excellent and it was incredibly rewarding to hear all those young people talk about their ambitions for themselves and how St Paul's can help them reach them. Offer letters have gone out and Year 11 can now focus on their upcoming GCSE's. A number of Year 11's have also had their college interviews and offers and they too should be very proud of themselves.

Sixth Form mock exams have gone well and all students have been working hard on assessments in class. The next set of mocks will be Year 9 at the end of February and then Year 11 core mocks in March.

A number of our Year 11 went on a trip to Oxford in order to inspire them for university choices.

These young people, known as our 'Golden Graduates', have the potential to get the top grades needed at GCSE and A Level in order to apply for Oxford and Cambridge. My thanks to Ms Warrilow and Mrs Bhana for organising the initiative and the trip and to Mrs Gahir and Mr Bottoms for accompanying them. The group will continue to be monitored and supported towards this goal should they wish to take it.
