Dear Parents/Carers,

As we come to the end of another school year, I want to thank you for your continued support. So much of what we do and want to achieve as a school relies on you as parents/carers. Ensuring that your child attends school regularly, knows to follow the rules and be respectful and work hard are all really important messages; the relationship between school and home must be strong one for your child to know we are united in our expectations.

So many wonderful things have happened this year from our Trust public speaking competition, our Duke of Edinburgh expeditions, Menphys concert, sports events, Awards Evenings and of course Ofsted – it's been an incredibly busy year with so much to be pleased and thankful for. My thanks to all the staff who have organised, run and been involved in celebration and enrichment events for our students over the course of the year and those of our support staff teams who support us all so well.

As is our St Paul's tradition now we were delighted to have Year 5 children from our feeder primaries with us experiencing their taster days. They were a joy to have and we look forward to seeing them and their families at our Year 6 Open Evening on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September. We were also pleased to see all our new incoming Year 7 at their induction day last week and their parents at the Induction Evening. We know both the children and their parents will be great additions to our St Paul's family.

As we now think ahead to next year, there are a few things to make you aware of;

# **Attendance**

It is important that your child attends school every day. Should your child have to have time off you must let us know by calling the school before 9am and leaving a message on the student absence line. You must do this on each day of the absence. With regards to holidays, I do not authorise holidays during term time. Please do not be upset if you are told this and you are issued with a fixed term penalty notice. I fully understand the cost of holidays differ dramatically when they are taken out of school holiday time but children are legally supposed to be in school and therefore I cannot authorise the leave request.

### **Behaviour**

The vast majority of our students behave really well but when things do go wrong our sanctions are very clear. We have produced a shortened parent version of our much longer behaviour policy. I hope you find this a useful document to helping you understand our sanctions and so on.

We do expect parents to support us in ensuring students attend detentions. You can help by making sure you have the Arbor app and checking your emails regularly. We will alert you to a detention through these means as well as sending you an Arbor text message. Those students for whom we have a mobile number for will also receive a text message at the end of the school day.

A small change to our detentions next year is our Friday C2 detention for no homework. We will make students aware of this in our back to school assemblies in August.

# **Evacuation and Invacuation**

We hold regular evacuation drills for things like a fire but we have not ever done an Invacuation drill. We would have an Invacuation should there be a real or perceived danger on the school grounds. This would mean having to "lock down" the whole school. We do have school procedures for this which says parents will get a text alert saying we have a lockdown and ask that you **do not** come to the school.

We would then let you know once we are out of the lockdown situation. We also ask that you do not advertise the lockdown on social media or publicly criticise us for having a lockdown. Everything we would do would be for the safety of students and staff. At some point during the next academic year we will have an Invacuation drill; we will tell you in the text that it is a drill.

# Uniform

How students wear their uniform reflects their attitude to school and our rules. I expect uniform to be worn properly and this means:

- 1. Shirts tucked in
- 2. Blazers and ties to be worn at all times
- 3. School skirts to be knee length or longer and not rolled up
- 4. School trousers to be tailored and straight leg
- 5. No facial piercings other than for religious or cultural reasons. There should be one piercing per ear
- 6. No excessive make up or false eyelashes
- 7. No long coloured false nails or polish. Short French manicure is acceptable
- 8. No boots
- 9. No logo ankle socks i.e. Nike

The new school skirts will certainly solve the length and style of skirt problem. Should girls roll the skirt up they will be issued with a C2 immediately. For those girls who choose to wear trousers instead please be aware that leggings, black jeans/jeggings, skinny, tapered or flared trousers are not allowed. For guidance please click on the links in the attached document to view acceptable trousers. If your child comes to school in other than straight leg ones, we will contact you immediately and issue a C2 detention.

Our approach to non-compliance with regards to uniform will be to inform you, issue detentions and then persistent non-compliance will result in isolation and in extreme situations, suspension.

Parents can use their Pupil Premium allowance to help pay for uniform where appropriate. Anyone genuinely struggling with purchasing an item of uniform can contact me directly.

Our preloved shop has various boys and girls blazers, PE kit and a few ties. Do call the school and Mrs Mulla can advise on the current stock. If you have items of uniform you no longer need, please do drop it into us; many families have benefited from donations already made.

### Spencefield Lane

I continue to be committed to resolving the traffic/parking issues on Spencefield Lane. Along with Krishna Avanti we have held meetings with local councillors and I am in contact with Deputy Mayor, Adam Clarke. Everyone acknowledges the issues and are working together to offer some solutions. I am due an update following a series of meetings held and I will keep you informed as soon as I hear more.
