PREPARATORY TASKS:

To get yourselves thinking about Sociology, I would like you to research and complete the tasks below. Sociology is a really interesting subject that many of you will be able to relate to in one way or another. I am very passionate about this subject and I hope that you too find it enjoyable. The following tasks are a good area to start thinking about the study of Sociology. It is really important that you keep up to date with the News around you and have an interest in the society that we live in.

Key topics- find and cut out two newspapers article relating to any of the following areas: Family diversity, Marriage, Divorce, Poverty, Childhood

Once you have picked the news articles, I want you to think about what they illustrate, what it suggests about the society that we live in in preparation of a class discussion, could even think about how the media portrays the article/ story.

2. Key perspectives: I would like you to have a think about the following key sociological perspectives. - Marxism, Functionalism, Feminism

You will need to research these areas, try and work out what these perspectives are studying within society. Also write notes on these and have a think about how these could link back to the two news articles that you have previously selected. You could do this in the form of a poster for example; however I will leave it up to you how you want to present your work. You do need to be prepared to feedback to the class, myself or a small group the information which you have found out.

ASSESSMENT FOCI: I will be looking at which articles you have selected to use and I will also be looking at how you work within a small group, pairs, the quality of your research and your ability to engage in a class discussion.






