It's okay to make mistakes. Getting it wrong is how we learn how to get it right!

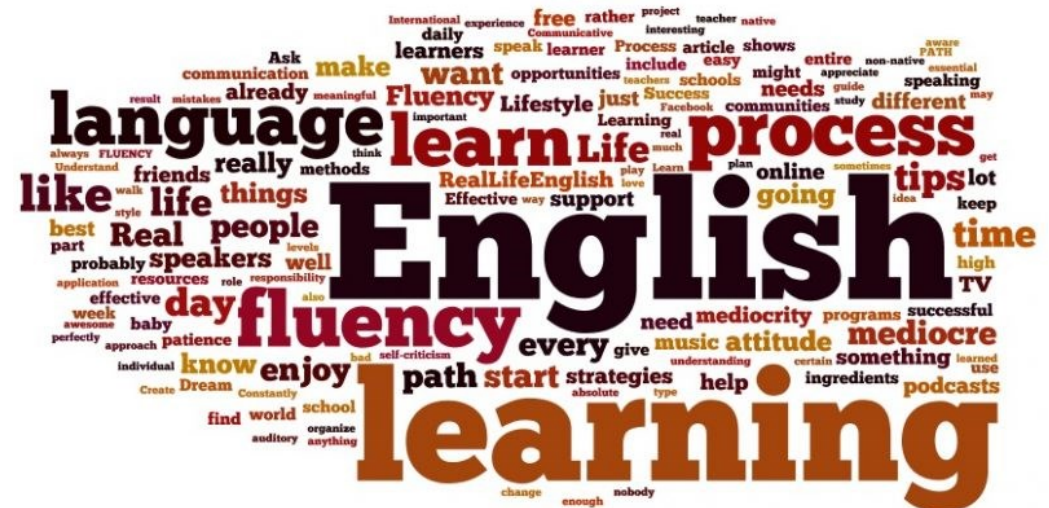

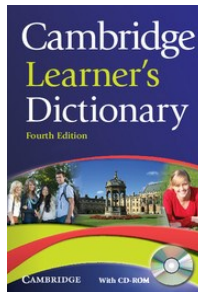


School is not the only place where you can learn English.

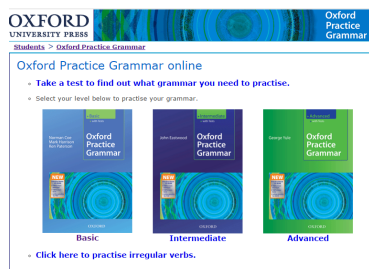
