Dear Parents/Carers,

As we come to the end of another school year, I want to thank you all. So much of what we do and want to achieve as a school relies on you as parents/carers. Ensuring that your child attends school regularly, follows the rules and knows how to be respectful and work hard are all important messages and allows them to have a positive experience in school. The relationship between school and home must be strong for your child to know we are united in our expectations.

So many wonderful things have happened this year from our Trust public speaking competition, our Duke of Edinburgh expeditions, overseas trips, the Menphys concert, Carnegie event, sports events, awards evenings, year 11 and 13 Masses, proms, Year 7, 8 and 9 retreats and so much more, it has been a year with so much to be pleased and thankful for. My thanks to all the staff who have organised, run and been involved in celebration and enrichment events for our students over the course of the year, to our support staff teams who assist us all so well and to all of you as parents for your support.

We were so pleased to see all our new incoming Year 7 at their induction day last week, they were a joy to host. We know both the children and their parents will be great additions to our St Paul's family. Our Year 6 Open Evening is on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> October 4.30-7pm and we look forward to welcoming and seeing students and their families then. Sixth form open evening is 7<sup>th</sup> November 4.30-7pm.

As we now think ahead to next year, there are a few things to make you aware of:

## Attendance and National changes to dealing with unauthorised pupil absence from school

It is important that your child attends school every day. Should your child have to have time off you must let us know by calling the school before 9am and leaving a message on the student absence line. You must do this on each day of the absence. With regards to holidays, I do not authorise holidays during term time. Please do not be upset if you are told this and you are issued with a fixed term penalty notice. I fully understand the cost of holidays differ dramatically when they are taken out of school holiday time, but children are legally required to be in school and therefore I cannot authorise the leave request the Trust Attendance Policy is available on our website and can be viewed here Attendance - St Paul's Catholic School (st-pauls leicester.sch.uk)

The national changes to dealing with unauthorised pupil absence from school, was emailed to all parents on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> July; the issuing of Penalty Notices are not my decision, the school or the Trust, they are nationally regulated by the government.

### Behaviour

The vast majority of our students behave really well but when things do go wrong our sanctions are very clear. We have produced a shortened parent version of our behaviour policy. I hope you find this a useful document in helping you understand our sanctions and so on.

## **Evacuation and Invacuation**

We would have an Invacuation should there be a real or perceived danger on the school grounds. This would mean having to "lock down" the whole school. We do have school procedures for this which says parents will get a text alert saying we have a lockdown and ask that you do not come to the school. We would then let you know once we are out of the lockdown situation. We also ask that you do not advertise the lockdown on social media or publicly criticise us for having a lockdown. Everything we would do would be for the safety of students and staff. At some point during the next academic year, we will have an Invacuation drill; we will tell you in the text, that it is a drill.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

How students wear their uniform reflects their attitude to school and our rules. I expect uniform to be worn properly and this means:

- 1. Shirts tucked in
- 2. Blazers and/or a badged jumper and ties to be worn at all times
- 3. Tartan school skirts knee length or longer and not rolled up
- 4. School trousers to be tailored and straight leg
- 5. No facial piercings other than for religious or cultural reasons; there should be one piercing per ear
- 6. No excessive make up or false eyelashes
- 7. No long coloured false nails or polish. Short French manicure is acceptable
- 8. Footwear should be all black with no visible logos and no boots
- 9. No logo ankle socks i.e. Nike





For those girls who choose to wear trousers instead of the skirt, please be aware that leggings, black jeans/jeggings, skinny, tapered or flared trousers are not allowed. For guidance, please click on the links in the attached document to view acceptable trousers.

The rule on jumpers and blazers is that students must either wear the v neck badged jumper or the blazer. They can of course be worn together. Students are not permitted to wear a jumper without the badge. The school badge is on order and once these arrive in school, we will let you know. Until then blazers should be worn.

Our approach to non-compliance with regards to uniform will be to inform you, issue detentions and then persistent non-compliance will result in isolation and in extreme situations, suspension. Parents can use their Pupil Premium allowance to help pay for uniform where appropriate. Our preloved shop has various boys and girls blazers, shirts, PE kit and ties. Do call the school and Mrs. Patel can advise on the current stock.

This Friday is non-uniform day, if you have items of uniform you no longer need, please do drop it into us; many families have benefited greatly from donations already made. We will buy back school skirts (£10) and badged jumpers (£5), both should be in good condition in order to re-sell them in our shop.

#### **School Priorities 2024–2025**

These include building links with parishes, to continue to improve the quality of teaching and learning for all students thus affecting outcomes for all, to build on the work already done on behaviour in order to strengthen behaviour and culture across the school aspiring to be outstanding in this area, and to futher strengthen our enrichment offer across the school.

So much work has already gone on with these priorities and next year will be an opportunity to build on that work. From August, Sixth Form will have an hour on a Tuesday afternoon to engage on all kinds of enrichment including volunteering in our feeder primaries and in care homes and engaging in tutoring and mentoring here at school. ### **Results Day Arrangements**

The national results days are:

- 15th August for all A Level, AS and other Level 3 courses including BTEC
- 22nd August for all GCSEs and other Level 2 courses including BTEC

Students have two options on the morning of the national results days.

Option 1: Students can collect their results from St. Paul's from 8 - 10am in the morning of results day.

Option 2: Examination results will be on G4S by 10am on the morning of results day.

#### **Enrolment for Sixth Form**

Students should come in to collect results so that they are able to enrol and confirm their subjects. Enrolment will be available all day on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and until 1pm on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Staff will be on hand for careers appointments and to support with results.

In the first stage of appeals, JCQ has stated that all students must appeal to their centre (school) not to the exam board.
