Sustainability & Climate Action

Over the next few weeks, we have a number of trees and hedge plants provided by The Woodland Trust, to plant. We've also started to revive the Polytunnel, planting what will hopefully become the Evington Chili Farm as the weather warms up and the raised beds, getting students involved again in the production of local food. Members of the Student Council have put together a couple of short surveys to see which students might want to be a core part of the sustainability team or just help, by volunteering on a casual basis; the enthusiasm by both students and staff in getting involved, has been very impressive.
