WELCOME

Welcome to St. Paul's Catholic Sixth Form. A fully inclusive, highly ambitious school which places each student firmly at the centre of our relentless drive to provide academic excellence and intellectual challenge in a stimulating, caring, well-resourced environment.



Year on year, all of our students who apply for University are successful in gaining places, with significant numbers studying at Russell Group institutions. The reasons for this are simple: teaching has been consistently praised by OFSTED as outstanding.

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As well as this, our relatively small class sizes, and the expertise of our staff, mean that personal and academic support is never far away. That extra layer of care that we offer has led to St Paul's being consistently placed as the highest achieving Sixth Form in the area where students make excellent progress. In addition, we take pride in developing our students to become well rounded, responsible and articulate young adults ready to embark in the next stage of their journey. In addition to the curriculum support that we offer, we have a dedicated pastoral team led by the Head and Assistant Head of Sixth Form who ensure that students are able to meet the demands of transition from Year 11 to Year 12 and can do so seamlessly and, if help is needed, it is provided in a caring, supportive environment.

EXPERTISE & SUPPORT

High levels of expertise and support are also provided when preparing students for their Level 4 Apprenticeship and University applications via our tutor team and dedicated Careers team.



Finally, and most importantly, our school ethos is based on the Gospel values found at the heart of our community. Respect and love for all, understanding of the perspectives of others, acceptance of our responsibilities as citizens of the world, and giving as much as we can to those in need of our support are all central to this.

We pride ourselves on providing a superb experience for our students here at St. Paul's. A number of our students have been with us since Year 7 and we also warmly welcome many students who have studied for their GCSE's elsewhere and for whom we have a tailored support programme to enable them to settle into life at St. Paul's from the moment they enrol. ST PAUL'S STUDY PROGRAMMES

Programmes at St. Paul's are varied. Students can choose from over 20 different A Level subjects, ranging from Maths and the Sciences, to the Arts, Humanities and Modern Foreign Languages. All facilitating subjects (those most valued by the best universities) are taught here. The A Level courses we offer are challenging. This is why we require all of our students to have achieved a minimum of four GCSE passes at Grade 4 or above and two passes at Grade 5 or above which includes English and Maths. Some individual A Level courses such as Maths and the Sciences will require more than this. We do offer a small number of BTEC courses, for example in Creative Media at Levels 2 and 3.

We offer students a number of leadership responsibilities across our community; from mentoring and coaching programmes; the opportunity to organise and manage events to fundraise for charity; to volunteer within our community at our feeder primary schools and to provide tuition to others, are just some of the opportunities that we offer which help to develop a range of vital skills required for life beyond St. Paul's.

To enhance and broaden students' knowledge, we offer extra-curricular visits which develop students 'cultural capital'; theatre visits, museum trips, field work in the great outdoors and excursions to Poland and Rome are just some of the opportunities open to all of our students.

Capitalising on these experiences offers students a broader learning approach that we pride ourselves on, contextualising classroom learning with real life experiences.


Academic success is what we strive for here at St. Paul's. Just as important is the development of the whole student, and providing you with the skills and experience to be ready to face the next challenges when you leave us.

Our wide variety of enrichment options offer students, for an hour a week, the opportunity to learn a foreign language, take part in cookery classes to prepare you for living on a budget, engage in a range of different sports, get involved in charity work or gain experience volunteering at one of our feeder primary schools. In addition, Year 12, students undertake work experience, with the view of gaining an insight into chosen career paths, and enhancing their personal statements for university application the following autumn.
