Cars on Site

Whilst I understand this might be inconvenient, I must remind you that the rule about parents not driving onto the school site is still in place. Parents are asked to drop off and pick up outside the school (Spencefield Lane) and to not drive onto the school site. Only those parents who have been issued with a pass, are permitted to drive onto the school site; these passes are only issued upon certified medical evidence. If you feel that your child meets the criteria for a pass, then please contact my PA, Mrs. Moss cmoss@st-pauls.leicester.sch.uk. The number of cars driving through causes a huge safety risk to the students. If a member of staff asks you to move your car off site, then please do so. We really must work together to ensure the safety of our young people. Additionally, when collecting students from after school clubs, after 4pm, parents should not be parking along the kerb outside reception; car park spaces should be available at this time so please use them. All students should be off site by 4.30pm. We cannot have students hanging around the school building unsupervised. Any student waiting for parents after 4:30pm, can do so outside the front of the school, or at the school gates.
