

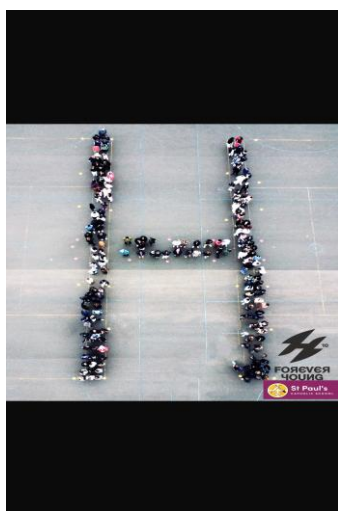


# ST PAUL'S CATHOLIC SCHOOL & SIXTH FORM

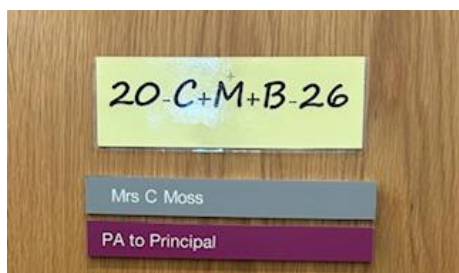
## Spiritual life

## Admissions

I update you every year on Year 7 applications and I am pleased that yet again, we have had so many applications for a place in our new Year 7 in August seeing a 16% increase on the previous year.

We have ranked 414 applications and I will offer 185 places; those offers will go out nationally, on 2<sup>nd</sup> March. The increase in applications reflect the attendance numbers at our Open Evening back in September and the very positive and supportive feedback we received on the night. It is



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hugely rewarding to see our popularity and reputation continue to grow, which is due to our wonderful and dedicated staff, having high expectations, excellent GCSE outcomes ranking in the top 6 schools in the City and County for 2025 outcomes! None of that is possible without you, our supportive parents. We all continue to push St. Paul's to be the very best!

We interviewed over 165 Year 11 students on Tuesday this week for a place in our Sixth Form and I have approximately 125 places to offer. Those interviewed, were from St. Paul's and from many schools in the City and County. All offers are conditional and subject to GCSE results; we wish all of those interviewed, the very best in their up-coming exams.

## GCSE's

GCSE Exam season starts on 27th April with the MFL Orals. GCSE written papers start on 8th May (Sociology); A Level live exams start on 5th May. We keep all of those young people, families and their teachers in our prayers at this time.

## Year 11 support

Our programme of support for Year 11 includes

- After school revision sessions
- Sixth Form Tutoring – Year 12 students who achieved very high GCSE grades have been matched with Year 11's in the same subject; tutoring sessions, are personalised and may be in small groups.
- Mock Exams, core subjects in the Sports Hall 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> March, all others in classes
- Easter School 30<sup>th</sup> March – 1<sup>st</sup> April, staff delivering structured and targeted revision

## DofE Programme and Fundraising Update

This year, 105 students have signed up to the Duke of Edinburgh's Award programme, with a further 10 students interested in joining at Gold level. Through DofE, pupils gain new skills, challenge themselves physically, and contribute to their communities. The programme builds confidence and supports the development of vital life skills such as teamwork, organisation, self-reliance, and interpersonal skills across all sections of the award.



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## **Bronze Award (2025–2026)**

We currently have spaces available in both boys' and girls' groups:

- Training Expedition: 23 April
- Qualifying Expedition: 24–25 April
- Location: Tilton on the Hill (for both expeditions)

## **Silver Award (2025–2026)**

There are two spaces available across one boys' group and one girls' group:

- Training Expedition: 17–19 June
- Qualifying Expedition: September
- Location: Peak District (for both expeditions)

We have been running fundraising activities to support equipment purchases and to help pupils who may struggle with the cost of accessing the DofE programme. Funds raised to date:

- Parental contributions: £60, plus £260 set aside to fund a place for a pupil requiring financial support (yet to be allocated)
- “Guess the Jellybeans” (Christmas): £10
- DofE Tuck Shop: £2,131 raised year to date

Equipment purchased so far:

- 70 rucksacks: £1,500

We are currently looking to purchase 20 Trangia stoves, costing £70 each. As we continue to build our own stock of equipment, the overall cost of running the DofE programme will reduce, helping to make it more accessible for pupils in future years.
