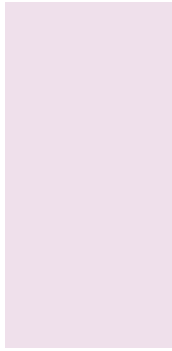
Finally in Task 3, it is also necessary to look at contemporary society using societal examples:

The following task is getting you to start thinking about areas of study in Sociology. It is important that you keep up to date with the News around you and have an interest in the society that we live in – as examiner's credit use of contemporary examples, built into sociological material.

1. Key topics-For this task, please find and cut out two newspapers articles relating to any of the following areas: -
Family diversity (different types of family structure)
Marriage, Divorce, Cohabitation,
Poverty,
Childhood
Demographic trends in Society
Domestic labour – responsibilities, childcare, paid work

Once you have picked the news articles, I want you to think about what they illustrate, what it suggests about the society that we live in in preparation of a class discussion, think about how the media portrays the article/ story.

2. Key perspectives: I would like you to have a think about the following key sociological perspectives, you have researched into earlier; how might they link to the theories below. -
